BRYAN TUDOR

Bryan Tudor was first elected to the Clinic Board in 2000, was elected again in 2002 and was Board Chair from 2004-2008. He was re-elected in 2019 and 2022 and has recently served as Board Secretary and Chair of the Member Relations Committee.



His background is agriculture. Bryan worked for Saskatchewan Wheat Pool for many years in the fields of member relations, co-operative governance, agricultural policy development and communications. He retired from the Pool when it ceased being a co-operative organization. Since then, he has undertaken 11 short-term volunteer assignments with the Canadian Co-operative Association (CCA – now known as the Co-operative Development Foundation of Canada) in China, Mongolia, Uganda, and Ghana, mostly providing training on co-operative governance issues to directors of small co-ops and credit unions.

Since 2006, he has been Chair of the local Social Services Appeals Committee. He is also the Executive Director of the Saskatchewan Bed and Breakfast Association, a not-for-profit membership organization of B&B owner/operators. In the past, he has served on the boards of the Saskatchewan Council for International Co-operation (SCIC), Save the Children Canada, and Prairie Lily Funeral Co-op (as chairperson of those organizations), the Saskatchewan Co-operative Association (SCA), and the Regina and District Food Bank.

Bryan has received a Global Co-operator Award from the CCA, a Saskatchewan Co-operative Order of Merit Award through SCA, and a Global Citizen Award from the SCIC.

He believes strongly in the value of co-operative organizations and is inspired by the history and the potential of the Clinic. Bryan thinks it is important that the Clinic retain its "co-operativeness" since the co-operative model is what makes the Clinic distinct and responsive to the needs of the members of the community.
