She has also worked at the Saskatchewan Association of Health Organizations (SAHO) and Health Shared Services Saskatchewan (3sHealth). During her time there, she was responsible for Member Relations with over 100 health related organizations in the province, and communications liaisons with the 12 health regions, the Saskatchewan Cancer Agency, and the Ministry of Health. While on the board of the Clinic, she acted as Interim Executive Director for 6 months in 2021, gaining significant insight into operations and culture of the Clinic.

Other Board experience includes 6 years on the University of Regina Alumni Association, and 18 years on the Board of Sherwood Co-op (7 years as President). She is in her 7<sup>th</sup> year with the Regina Public Library board, currently serving as Chair.
